



*DATO DR. AMARJIT S. GILL*

Dato Dr. Amarjit graduated (MBBS) from Grant Medical College, Bombay in 1973. He served as a Houseman and Medical Officer / Registrar at the General Hospital, Penang till 1978. In 1976 / 77 he was seconded to the Malaysian Armed Forces as a Medical Officer. He opted for private practice in 1979 with Drs. Young, Newton & Partners, Kuala Lumpur, where he went on to become a partner from 1982. In 1990 he established his own practice at Klinik Negara, Kuala Lumpur. He successfully obtained Post-Graduate Certificates in Sports Medicine (1988) and Genito-Urinary Medicine in 1989. He was elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Health (UK) in 1990.

He is the Past President of Malaysian Association of Sports Medicine (MASM) from 2006 – 2010 and has served MASM in various capacities since 1997 and is currently a Vice-President. He also served two terms as Chairman of the Society of Sports Medicine, Malaysian Medical Association (MMA) from 2005 – 2007.

In addition, Dato Dr. Amarjit has been an outstanding sportsman having represented and captained Bombay Varsity at Hockey (1968 - 1971). Upon his return to Malaysia he represented the Malaysian Armed Forces & Penang at Hockey & Cricket, in 1976 / 77 & 1977 / 78, respectively. Following that he went on to represent and captain both the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur & Malaysia at Cricket from 1979 – 1989. To date he is recognized as the most successful captain, in Malaysian cricket history. Following his retirement he served the Malaysian Cricket Association in various capacities, culminating in being the Deputy President in 2009 – 2010.

He has been the doctor to the National Cricket Team from 1979 – 2010, Medical Director Jonah Jones Rugby Tournament from 1998 - 2005 and is currently the Chief Tournament Physician of the WTA Malaysian Tennis Open, since 2011.

For his contributions to the nation, Dato Dr. Amarjit was conferred a DATUKSHIP by HRH, the Sultan of Pahang in 2001.

For his services in the Malaysian Armed Forces, he was rewarded with the “Pingat Jasa Malaysia” (JPM) Medal in September 2015 – a medal given to those who served with distinguished gallantry, chivalry, sacrifice & loyalty to the King & Country, during the communist insurgency.
